July-August 2015	Child Reach Nepal	10 semi-permanent classrooms benefitting 300 children in Sindhupalchowk. Designed in consultation with local communities and fitting government guidelines for semi-permanent structures, but earthquake resilient and robust enough to last 40 years. Schools are a key vehicle for delivering urgent post-disaster information on risks of trafficking, preventable diseases, nutrition, hygiene etc.	Sindupalchok District	£18,140
July-August 2015	Eco-Himal	Vocational training for 54 individuals including safe demolition, site-clearing, carpentry and masonry skills to help communities with reconstruction, develop local employment opportunities and transform local knowledge in earthquake resilient construction methods and impacting 2131 households, 24 schools and 2 health-post. Project area is remote, inhabited by some of the poorest, most vulnerable populace in Nepal with very limited access to development resources. July-August 2015	Women's Group Disability Rights (WGDR)	Counselling training sessions for teachers, local authorities, civil society groups and health workers to facilitate setting up of peer support groups for disadvantaged women, especially in the field of psychosocial disability. Dec-Jan	Advocacy Forum	A second grant was made to extend the livelihood income generation programme to 99 families in Palpa district, who lost their homes in the earthquake, but are receiving little help, because this district does not come up as one of the 14 most affected.	Palpa District	£16,000
Dec-Jan	BVS-Nepal	A one-year match-grant with <i>We Help Nepal</i> was made to cover BVS-Nepal's core capacity for a year. The organisation is NERA's primary in-country partner responsible for administering the grants on the ground, including all the reporting and responsibility for the audit of NERA in Nepal. Dec-Jan	BVS-Nepal	A grant to support the treatment (medicines, surgery, hospital costs and counseling) for 20-25 children, who lost their homes and have been living in temporary shelters and have suffered burns injuries and been admitted to Kanti Children's Hospital. Dec-Jan	BVS-Nepal & Volunteer for Change (VFC)	School building-Mulabari, Kalleri VDC, Dhading District. The reconstruction of the school is in the final stages, which is a particularly wonderful achievement based on the current difficulties imposed on the work by the economic blockade. However, as a result of this, the costs of building materials and transportation suffered serious inflation, which has meant the cost of building the school went up by £4,000. Dec-Jan	Women's Group Disability Rights (WGDR)	NERA will support WGDR with another grant for a Peer Support Programme, focused on women with psychosocial disabilities and at particular risk due to the earthquakes.
